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for 12 contrabasses or 1 contrabass with multiple delays

## Each player performs the same material:

on the G-string (alternately A-string in solo tuning), play each of the first 12 harmonic partials of the open string, beginning with the open string (see attached table)
each harmonic to be played successively in all available positions (fingerings as natural harmonics, played on one node at a time) beginning at the nut and ending at the bridge
each note is played in a single, mezzo-forte bow-stroke: as evenly and cleanly as possible
player to maintain a steady tempo, in the case of multiple performers all players adhere to a commonly agreed pulse
each new note begins on a beat of the steady pulse, though actual durations of notes may be varied as desired
as soon as a note has ended, players move to the next note as quickly as possible and play on the next available beat
the $2^{\text {nd }}$ player begins playing together with the first player's $2^{\text {nd }}$ partial the $3^{\text {rd }}$ player begins playing together with the first player's $3^{\text {rd }}$ partial similarly for all players: the $\mathrm{n}^{\text {th }}$ player begins playing with the first player's $\mathrm{n}^{\text {th }}$ partial subsequently each player proceeds independently, maintaining a common tempo for the onset of notes
multiple players may be replaced by a soloist with multiple delays and loudspeakers: in this case, the 11 delayed versions may be panned or spatially distributed to better distinguish the individual voices
